MAT WALES

The more able and talented students in Year 7 were given a special workshop last week using BBC Microbit computers. The students wrote computer programmes to control the cars motors to make it move and



turn, they then went a step further a wrote a programme to make another BBC Microbit become a bluetooth remote control. Finally the students were able to play robot wars with their cars. "We hope to be able to build these Microbit cars and roll this activity out to the other pupils in the school using some of our MAT students as Microbit ambassadors" said Mr Sharpe.

GEOLOGY

Newyddion Daeraeg Year 10 geologists spent a day studying the coal and Iron deposits at Amroth and Wisemans bridge in challenging conditions (blazing sun!). We located a seam of anthracite and 300 million year old fossil tree roots. We also were able to identify a range of sedimentary structures which told us that this area



was a delta close to the equator in the Carboniferous time period. We were also lucky enough to see the submerged forest from the ice age at low tide and we visited the ruined iron works at stepaside Thank you to PESST for providing a small coach so we could fit down the tiny lanes and park on a busy day and for supporting our field work.
